FOOD & NUTRITION ASSISTANCE

- Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) SNAP helps Minnesotans with low incomes get
 the food they need for sound nutrition and well-balanced meals. Approved participants get a debit card
 to use to buy food at many stores and farmers markets. In the past, SNAP was known as Food Stamps.

 the MFAP are the same as SNAP. The amount of monthly benefits a household can receive is based
 on the income, expenses and number of people in the household.

GENERAL INCOME ASSISTANCE

It provides money to people who can't work enough to support themselves, and whose income and resources are very low. People who get GA are also eligible for help with medical and food costs through Medical Assistance and the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP).
